ABOUT THE PROGRAM & PRESENTER

Financial Exploitation is a growing problem for both senior citizens and elder care professionals and has a \$3 billion impact on our economy annually. As an increasing proportion of Americans age past 65, many are forced to rely on others to handle their affairs, leaving them vulnerable to harm. This talk will address ways to recognize and resolve financial exploitation utilizing recently-enacted West Virginia statutes as well as focusing on the duties of elder care professionals to report such activity.

Dane W. Henry, Esq., is an attorney licensed to practice in West Virginia. He is currently employed in Legal Aid of West Virginia's Martinsburg office as a VOCA Staff Attorney. Mr. Henry graduated, with honors, from Shepherd University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer and Information Sciences, concentrating in Networking and Data Communication. After a term as a federal Information Technology contractor for the U.S. Coast Guard, Mr. Henry was accepted into The Pennsylvania State University's Dickinson School of Law in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. Following law school, Mr. Henry was offered a prestigious position as Senior Judicial Law Clerk for the Hon. Kevin A. Hess, then-President Judge of the Cumberland County Court of Common Pleas in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. Upon the retirement of Judge Hess, Dane returned to his IT roots by taking charge of Dickinson Law's IT department, combining his knowledge of IT and the law to assist faculty and students.
