ABOUT THE PROGRAM & PRESENTER

Kathleen (Kat) Stoll, Principal, Kat Consulting / Policy Director, West Virginians for Affordable Health Care / Campaign Director, West Virginia Together for Medicaid

Kat currently is the Policy Director for the West Virginians for Affordable Health Care, based in Charleston, WV. She also is the Campaign Director for the *West Virginia Together for Medicaid* campaign, a project of West Virginians for Affordable Health Care.

Kat works out of her home near Berkeley Springs and has been a West Virginia voter for more than 15 years. She has served more than 8 years on the board of West Virginians for Affordable Care. She is the principal of Kat Consulting, providing health policy and economic analysis with a focus on the lives of low-income people, with diverse state and national clients.

Prior to “retiring” to her home in West Virginia to live full-time three years ago, Ms. Stoll served as the Deputy Executive Director for Families USA, based in Washington, D.C. for 15 years. Families USA is a national non-profit organization dedicated to bringing the voices of consumers to health care debates at the national level and played a key role in the development and passage of the Affordable Care Act. In her leadership role at Families USA, Kat coordinated “strange bedfellow” coalitions and led strategic campaigns to advance the goals of Families USA. Kat oversaw the data analysis and wrote or oversaw drafts of Families USA’s monthly earned media reports.

Kat serves as a key spokesperson to the media on health policy issues including the Affordable Care Act, Medicaid, and Health System Improvement (payment and delivery reforms).

Prior to Families USA, Kat worked for the Center for Women Policy Studies and the National Health Law Program, both based in D.C. She is an attorney and has a Master’s degree in Economics.
